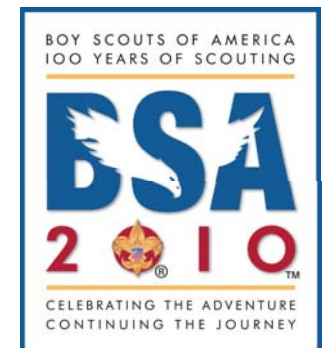

100th Anniversary Spotlight - Recruiting

A steady flow of youth into a Boy Scout troop or Cub Scout pack is essential to maintaining the unit's health. New Scouts bring energy and enthusiasm to the troop program. To avoid the pitfall of shrinking membership, try to add at least 10 new Scouts every year. Having a year-round growth plan in place will help attract new Scouts.

The first step for any recruitment effort is for each unit to appoint a committee member to serve as the unit membership chair. This person will develop and implement a year-round growth plan that incorporates all methods of recruitment, working closely with the community, the district membership committee, and the unit commissioner.

100th Anniversary Spotlight - Scouting for Food

Scouting for Food is an annual event where all Scout councils in Northern California host simultaneous food drives for their local food banks. The Monterey Bay Area Council partners with the Food Bank for Monterey County, Second Harvest Food Bank of Santa Cruz and San Benito Counties, and Community Pantry of San Benito County to deliver foodstuffs to local food pantries and other programs.

In 2008, the Monterey Bay Area Council collected over 25,000 pounds of food and had 29 packs, troops, and crews participate. Every unit should participate in this event, held annually on the second and third Saturdays in November.

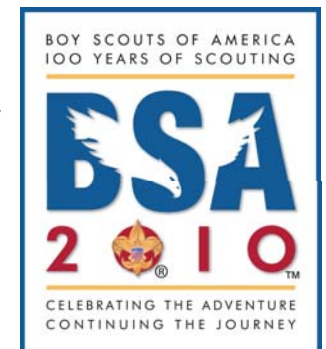

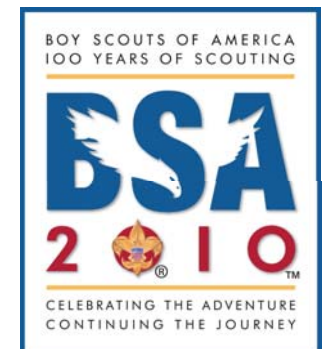

100th Anniversary Spotlight - Order of the Arrow

The Order of the Arrow (OA) was founded by Dr. E. Urner Goodman and Carroll A. Edson in 1915 at the Treasure Island Camp of the Philadelphia Council, Boy Scouts of America. It became an official program experiment in 1922 and was approved as part of the Scouting program in 1934.

In 1948 the OA, recognized as the BSA's national brotherhood of honor campers, became an official part of the national camping program of the Boy Scouts of America.

The purpose of the Order of the Arrow is fourfold: (1) To recognize those Scout campers who best exemplify the Scout Oath and Law in their daily lives, (2) To develop and maintain camping traditions and spirit, (3) To promote Scout camping, and (4) To crystallize the Scout habit of helpfulness into a life purpose of leadership in cheerful service to others.

Who can say that in such an atmosphere a youth's mind is not reached, his faith not freshened, or his heart not stirred? Or that, in ways that are a mystery to us all, he will not grow closer to the man he is becoming?

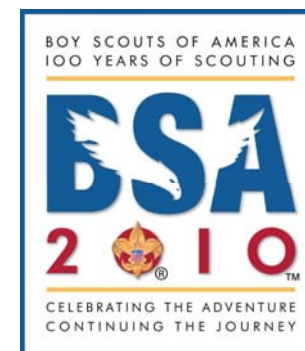

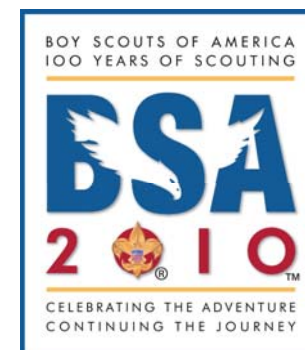

100th Anniversary Spotlight - National Summertime Pack Award

The purpose of the National Summertime Pack Award is to encourage packs to provide a year-round program by continuing to meet during the time periods when school is out of session for several weeks or months. If a pack is in a "year-round school" (or is part of a home-school association), the pack could earn the Summertime Pack Award by having a special pack activity during those breaks.

Qualifying packs receive a colorful streamer for their pack flag. Dens with an average attendance of at least half their members at the three summer pack events will be eligible for a colorful den participation ribbon. Boys who participate in all three pack events are eligible to receive the National Summertime Pack Award pin, which they can wear on the right pocket flap of their uniform.
